The Children's Museum of Indianapolis is the world's largest [children's museum](#). It is located at 3000 [North Meridian Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, United States](#), in the United Northwest Area neighborhood of the city. The museum is accredited by the [American Alliance of Museums](#). It is 472,900 square feet (43,933.85 m²) with five floors of exhibit halls and receives more than one million visitors annually. Its collection of over 120,000 artifacts and exhibit items is divided into three domains: the American Collection, the Cultural World Collection, and the Natural World Collection. Among the exhibits are a simulated [Cretaceous dinosaur](#) habitat, a [carousel](#), and a [steam locomotive](#). The museum's focus is family learning; most exhibits are designed to be interactive, allowing children and families to actively participate.

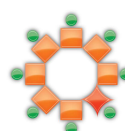
